A RESOLUTION DESIGNATING CHESTNUT AVENUE AS A “TWO WAY” ROADWAY BETWEEN ITS INTERSECTIONS WITH KIRKWOOD HWY AND RUTH ROAD

WHEREAS, A request has been made for the Mayor and Council to consider removing the restrictions on traffic flow to allow two-way travel on a portion of Chestnut Avenue; and

WHEREAS, the Elsmere Bureau of Police have reviewed the affected roadway and determined, that if the Mayor and Council were to determine it would be in the best interest of the Town to allow traffic flow in two directions on this roadway, it should be removed in the manner described below.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF ELSMERE AS FOLLOWS

1. The portion of Chestnut Avenue located between its intersections with Kirkwood Highway and Ruth Road permit traffic flow in two directions.
2. The Public Works Department shall remove all “Do Not Enter” and “One Way” traffic signs located on Chestnut Avenue where it intersects with both Kirkwood Hwy and Ruth Road.
3. A “No Parking to Corner” sign shall be erected at the end of the yellow curb on the east bound side of Chestnut Avenue at the intersection with Kirkwood Hwy.

This resolution removes the current traffic flow restrictions and makes Chestnut Avenue a “Two Way” roadway between Kirkwood Hwy and Ruth Road.
