May 4, 2024:

Occupied Stolen Vehicle Recovered

On Saturday May 4th at 3:00 PM, the Elsmere Police responded to the 900 block of Dover Avenue for the report of a hit and run accident. Officers made contact with the owner of the striking vehicle who was unaware it stolen earlier that day from the 900 Block of Baltimore Avenue. While on patrol in the area of the Wawa at 11:45 PM, officers were able to locate the vehicle which was occupied four times. When officers attempted to stop the vehicle, it fled and struck the center median on Kirkwood Highway causing it to become disabled.

The four passengers fled on foot, however two of the passengers both juveniles ages 14 and 15 were apprehended. The 14-year-old passenger was charged with resisting arrest and released to a guardian. The 15-year-old driver was charged with theft of a motor vehicle, disregarding a police officer's signal, resisting arrest and several other traffic charges. The juvenile's bail was set at \$6500.00 secured and he was transferred to the New Castle County Detention Center.

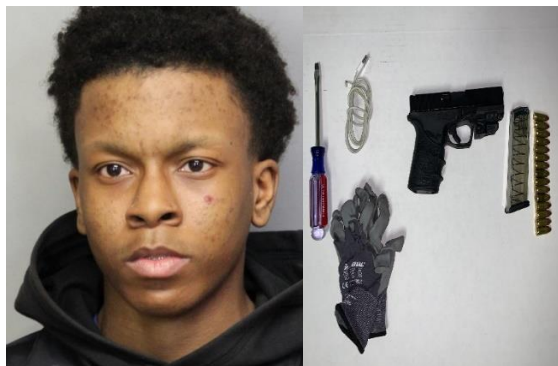
May 22, 2024:

Suspect Arrested With Firearm

On May 22, 2024 at 1:40 AM, members of the Elsmere Police Department conducted a pedestrian stop of two suspicious individuals in the Vilone Village area. One of the subjects was identified as a 17-year-old male from the City of Wilmington, and the other subject was identified as Alim Jackson, 19, of the unit block of Elsmere Boulevard. Jackson was found to have in his possession a loaded 9mm untraceable firearm, gloves, a flathead screwdriver, and a USB charging cord.

The juvenile was charged with Night Prowling and a Curfew Violation and released to his guardians. Jackson was charged with Carrying a Concealed Deadly Weapon a Firearm (felony), Possession of a Firearm by a Person Prohibited (felony), Possession of Ammunition by a Person Prohibited (felony), Possession of an Untraceable Firearm (felony), Possession of Burglar Tools (felony), Night Prowling (violation), and Jaywalking (violation). His bail was set at \$39,100.00 secured and was remanded to the Howard R. Young Correctional Facility.
